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This week in Science...

Year 9 – Getting to know the brain

Students in Year 9 has been studying the processes involved in the human body that carry out homeostasis – the tendency of biological systems to maintain relatively constant conditions inside the body. While many body systems have been discussed a particular focus has been on the Nervous System.

Almost every response in the body is related to the messages sent through the nervous system. Students have looked at the components of the brain as part of the nervous system and the areas of the brain that control the functions of the body.

Students were very keen to dissect a sheep brain and locate these areas on a real specimen.

Year 7 Separating Mixtures

Students in Year 7 have been honing their skills in the science laboratory to attempt to separate components of a mixture using various separation techniques. Magnetic separation, filtration evaporation and chromatography have been some techniques the students are becoming familiar with.

Students will later be assessed on their laboratory skills this term. Students have made connections between the techniques practiced in the laboratory to real life situations where the filtration of the local town water has been discussed.

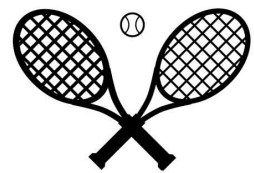
